Bruzer is shouting THANK YOU to Cathy Bisell and the whole team at the Bisell Pet Foundation for helping with the cost of his emergency surgery through their Grateful Pet Program! Through their support, HALF of Bruzer's extensive medical care has been covered!!!

Have you heard Bruzer's story before?? Well, here goes nothing. Bruzer was adopted into a loving family this summer and at first everything was going well. However, as their time together went on, his family noticed that Bruzer was not doing so hot. They exhausted all of their resources trying to get him well again, but ultimately decided that his medical needs were more than they could take on and brought him back to HSSW this fall.

As soon as Bruzer arrived back at HSSW, the team here recognized that he needed to get to an ER as soon as possible and that's what we did. Once at the ER, he went into surgery pretty quickly. The ER team found that he had a sliding hiatal hernia that essentially created a pocket in his diaphragm which allowed his liver to slip up into the pocket. The portion of his liver that slid into that pocket did die and slunk itself to the diaphragm. The surgery removed the necrotic portion of the liver, unadhered the tissues that needed to be removed, tacked his stomach, repaired the original hernia, and set his esophagus back in place. WHEW - that was a lot!!

After his surgery, he came back to HSSW and we began a new feeding and healing regimen for him. This included eating his meals sitting up like a person - in our case, we sat with him on our laps or in a Bailey Chair. This also included keeping his activity level low, keeping him relaxed, and giving him his daily medications. Bruzer was a great patient and is doing SO well now!! So well in fact, that he is now available for adoption!

The Importance of a Leash/Carrier

As we gear up for another great year of offering low-cost services to the public, we thought it would be a good time to do some housekeeping & share with our guests some safety reminders.

For the safety of our guests, their furry friends, and the animals we have on-site, all dogs must be leashed while on HSSW property. You may have a well behaved trained dog, but we also have a lot of dog traffic through our property daily, and a busy highway very close by. Let's keep everyone safe! Below are some tips for best success during your visit with your canine family members:

- A well fit collar or harness can ensure your pet stay's securely next to you.
- Using a 6-foot nylon or leather leash, allows for best control of your canine in any environment! We see many pets come in on retractable leashes, however they offer so much freedom to your furry friend, and give you little control.

We do ask that cats coming in for clinic appointments, be brought in, inside of a cat carrier! We even recommend bringing along a blanket or towel that smells like them, to cover the carrier with. We want to make their visit to HSSW as comfortable as possible, and this is a way to minimize stress while they are waiting for their appointment.

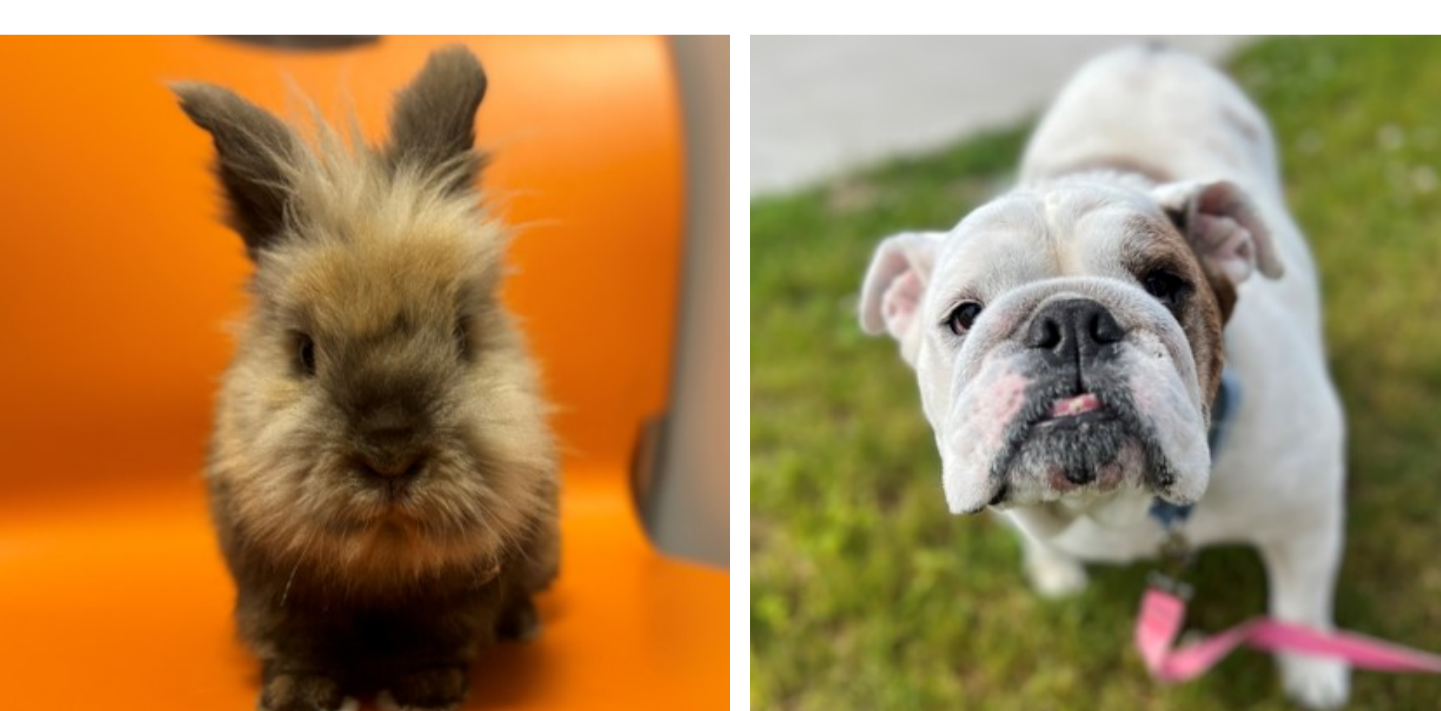
